




Sales Tax Changes: 2017 Review, 2018 Predictions

If 2018 ends up looking like our current year, we're in for a lot of changes when it comes to sales and use tax. 2017 ushered in tens of thousands of taxability changes across every U.S. state and several legislative changes impacted online sellers, manufacturers, service providers, and more.

Here's a look at 2017 by the numbers:

- 36,254 tax changes (including rate and product/service taxability)
- 80 sales and use tax compliance bills
- **26 states** offered amnesty on back taxes, penalties, and interest for online marketplace sellers
- **15 states** introduced or proposed consumers' use tax requirements for out of state online sellers
- 12 states proposed economic nexus on out-of-state businesses meeting certain sales thresholds of maximum gross receipts

What's in store for 2018?

Depending on what you sell and where you sell it, your business might see some big changes in 2018. Scott Peterson, U.S. tax policy expert and former Executive Director of the Streamlined Sales Tax Governing Board, offers a few of his own predictions for 2018.

- Many more taxability changes across key states: Whether we'll see over 36,000 changes again remains to be seen, but it's certain that we'll have more changes in the coming year.
- Broad changes to tax on services: Tax on services is dynamic and will continue to change as state lawmakers look to service providers for revenue. Learn more.
- Economic nexus bills pass in key states, more introduced through the year: Out-of-state companies with sales over a certain threshold will be required to register, file, and remit sales or use tax. Learn more.
- Consumers' use tax requirements impact online retailers: What started in Colorado and a handful of other states will likely spread across the U.S. A growing number of states are demanding non-collecting retailers disclose customer information to help them enforce consumer use tax compliance.
